# About this Composite Major

The Physical Education major is designed to prepare students for teaching physical education in grades K-12. Students will engage in content that includes the study of human anatomy and physiology, biomechanics, outdoor recreational pursuits, motor skills, and activities for the physical educator. At Valley City State University, our goal is to produce great physical educators who will make a difference in the lives of the students they teach. This goal is accomplished by providing students ample opportunities to practice and develop essential teaching skills while engaging in the physical education content. Students will become competent in the use of technology and will be able to demonstrate its application in the educational setting. Throughout the curriculum, learners will work with master teachers who will effectively prepare the students to teach in today's physical education classroom.

# **Flexible Degree Options**

#### **1. Online Physical Education**

- VCSU offers a fully online Physical Education degree program for working students or students who live outside the VCSU area. We are focused on providing a comprehensive and interactive program that allows our online students to pursue their educational goals in a non-traditional manner.
- 2. Physical Education with Adapted Physical Education Minor
  - This **major** and **minor** combination equips future educators with the skills needed to create inclusive learning environments for individuals with special needs. Through extended learning opportunities and practical experiences, students will develop an understanding of accommodating diverse needs, developing effective teaching strategies, and compliance with legal requirements. Students are encouraged to consider a minor in adapted physical education as it increases their employability and versatility as an educator.

#### 3. Physical Education and Health Education Double Major

• With this dual focus, students develop a diverse skill set which prepares the future educator to teach a broad range of courses. With the addition of courses focused on mental health, community health, disease, and drug prevention, students have the opportunity to learn about and develop the skills needed to provide holistic health instruction inside and outside of the classroom.

# **Teacher Education Requirements**

Students must apply for and be accepted into the VCSU Teacher Education Program to complete courses required for teacher certification. Students should plan to apply for acceptance into the Teacher Education Program after their sophomore year or the beginning of their junior year. This program requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 or higher and evidence of reading, writing, and math proficiency.
